Our Promise

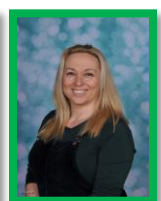

Who Can You Talk To?

You can talk to any adult in school — teachers, teaching assistants, lunchtime staff, or office staff.

You can also talk to our Safeguarding Team:

Tell Us If...

- Someone is hurting you or being unkind
- You feel scared or worried about something
- Someone is touching you in a way you don't like
- You see or hear something online that upsets you
- Someone asks you to keep a secret that makes you uncomfortable
- Something is happening at home that makes you sad or worried



Nothing is ever too small. If it worries you – it matters.

What We Will Do

- We will listen carefully.
- We will believe you.
- We might need to tell another grown-up so we can help.
- We will never be cross with you for speaking up.
- We will help you feel safe again.

Staying Safe Online

- ✓ Keep your name, address, and passwords private.
- ✓ Tell a grown-up if something online makes you feel upset.
- ✓ Never talk to or meet up with strangers online.
- ✓ Think before you share photos or messages.
