E emerging	Working at ARE	Working below ARE	Working below ARE

P progressing	Working above ARE	Working at ARE	Working at ARE
S secure	Working above ARE	Working above ARE	Working at ARE
M mastery	Working above ARE	Working above ARE	Working above ARE
X exceeding	Working above ARE	Working above ARE	Working above ARE

Example: A child in Y2 with an assessment level of 2E or 2D would be working at the expected level in the Autumn term. Alternatively, if a child in Y2 had an assessment level of 2E in the Spring term, they would be below the expected standard.
